

Pathway to Peace: Colombia Reaches Ceasefire Agreement with ELN Rebels

After countless efforts, Colombia and the ELN rebels have finally signed a ceasefire agreement on 9th June, 2023. The ceasefire agreement calls for an immediate end to hostilities and the start of a process of political dialogue. The national bilateral ceasefire will go into effect on August 3 and will be in effect for six months, while both parties aim to establish confidence. The agreement was signed in Havana, Cuba, and marks a major milestone in President Gustavo Petro's campaign for "total peace". The ELN is a Marxist-Leninist guerrilla group that has been fighting the Colombian government since the 1960s. The group has been considered responsible of carrying out bombings, kidnappings, and other acts of violence. The ELN has a long history of violence, and it remains to be seen whether the group will abide by the terms of the agreement.
